

2023 815HORTS LINE-UP FEATURES BING LIU'S LATEST ROCKFORD PREMIERE, 13 ACCLAIMED SHORT FILMS AND SUNDANCE SHORTS TOUR SCREENING

ROCKFORD, Ill., November 16, 2023: Plus Seven Company announced today that 13 short films have been selected for screening at 815HORTS: A 5HORT Film Festival, including Academy Award nominee Bing Liu's Rockford premiere of "What the Hands Do". Liu's latest short film will debut locally during the program's final prime time slot, followed by an onstage 5HORT Talk interview featuring Liu and moderator Peter Hawley, 815HORTS emcee and director of the Illinois Film Office. The 5HORT Awards will close the evening by awarding 2023 winners for Best 5HORT and Best Local/Regional 5HORT.

Set for Saturday, December 2, 2023 at the RPL Nordlof Center, the second annual 815HORTS, presented by the City of Rockford + Rockford Film Office, will feature an 815HORTS Matinees block at 3 p.m., the 2023 Sundance Film Festival Short Film Tour at 5 p.m., and an 815HORTS Prime Time block at 7 p.m. In addition, The 5HORT Route will be produced as a lunch and learn program from 12-2 p.m. at City Stage Studios, where up to 50 aspiring area filmmakers will learn from industry professionals.

"We're thrilled to welcome 815HORTS back to Rockford for another year," says **Tom McNamara**, City of Rockford mayor. "Rockford has an incredible amount of artistic talent, and this festival is a great way for us to showcase our region's creative and filmmaking community."

Of the 13 featured 815HORTS, seven films represent work by Rockford area natives while two selections are the work of Oscar-nominated filmmakers. This year's 815HORTS include (in order of scheduled screening):

Best known for directing "Minding the Gap"—which was nominated for Best Feature Documentary at the 91st Academy Awards and won a Peabody—**Bing Liu** was also a segment director on "America to Me", which premiered on Starz and was hailed as one of the best TV shows of the year. Liu also co-directed "All These Sons" with Josh Altman, which won Best Cinematography at the 2021 Tribeca Film Festival and the Maysles Award at the Denver International Film Festival. Liu's short documentary "What the Hands Do" had its world premiere at the 2023 Camden International Film Festival. He has been supported by Kartemquin's Diverse Voices in Documentary, a Film Independent Fellowship and Truer Than Fiction Award, the Garrett Scott Development Grant, the United States Artists fellowship, the SFFILM Westridge Fellowship, the Sundance Screenwriter and Director Labs, the Sundance Institute Asian American Fellowship, and the Concordia Fellowship. Liu is currently developing several fiction and non-fiction projects.
